





Saving Limbs, Saving Lives: World Diabetes Day Special Podcast



To mark World Diabetes Day, the Interprofessional Wound Care Association (IWCA) released a special podcast episode hosted by Dr. Bharat Kotru, a respected voice in the field of wound care and diabetic foot management. This insightful episode brought together two distinguished experts in their respective domains to shed light on the growing concern of diabetic foot complications—an issue that affects millions of individuals worldwide.



Dr. Ravi Kumar Mahajan, an eminent Plastic Surgeon and Head of the Department of Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery (Amandeep Group of Hospitals) shared his in-depth expertise on advanced surgical techniques and the pivotal role of plastic surgery in limb preservation and wound closure. His perspective highlighted how the

surgical innovations are crucial in preventing amputations and restoring mobility and quality of life for patients.

Dr. Puneet Arora, a leading **Diabetologist** from Amritsar, offered a comprehensive overview of the systemic impact of diabetes, focusing on early diagnosis, long-term metabolic control, and the importance of individualized patient care. He emphasized that diabetic foot is not merely a localized problem but a complex manifestation of uncontrolled systemic disease. Together, the discussion delved into the necessity of a multidisciplinary approach, integrating surgical care, endocrinology, and preventive strategies to improve outcomes. Both experts stressed the importance of early intervention, patient education, and collaborative clinical practices.


